





It has been a hard cold winter maintaining frozen Torrey Town Water meters. Torrey Town Water customers are reminded that any customer access to water meters and the disturbance of the insulating foam pillows may result in damage to the metering equipment and extra cost to the customer. For assistance accessing water metering equipment Torrey Town personnel are available upon request.

Personally I am happy to see March; hopefully we will soon begin to see temperatures rise above the freezing mark and the frost level reduce. When the weather does cooperate Torrey Town plans to finish minor water system construction and maintenance valve installations to complete the water project started in 2012.
